Many visitors stopped by to ask questions and the Club members were great representatives of the hobby. "Sammiches" were provided by the club.

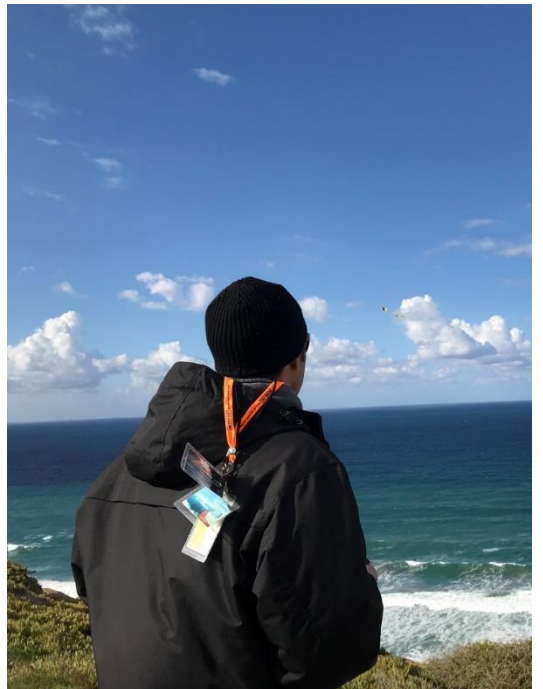

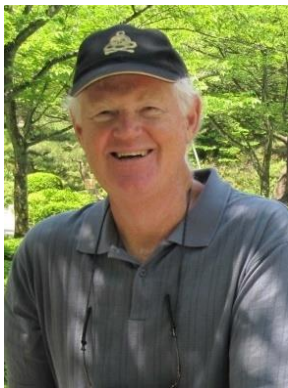

January DLG Contest Report – Ray Pili

We had perfect SoCal winter weather. Started out cold in the 60's then warmed up to the 70's. Hardly any wind for the first 4 rounds. Hardly any thermals to go around either. You had to fly smooth to take advantage of the light lift. That was too much for Bruno who arrived late and left early, something about CA in the wrong place. President Craig got his feet wet as a timer.

After the 4th round we had our discussion topic: 101 ways to break your plane. Jon and Cliff gave a great rundown on the JEM where breaking your plane was common.

A light breeze began after the 5th round started and we started getting two or three thermals per heat, and by AULD the air was active. Jon was making AULD upside down.

Congrats to Top Sportsman Justin Tolman and second place Sportsmans Dan Gebhardt flying his second contest (first contest with a Libelle and now flying a Snipe). Dan flew a 1000 on round 2 "last 3"!!! Honorable mention to Dale with his third place sportsman also flying his second contest.

Congrats to Gary for winning the contest and Jon and Tim for rounding out the top three. Only 2% (113 pts) separated the top three.

Scores are no drops and for 6 rounds.

Our optional Gunslinger 7th round was very interesting. The first 10-15-20-25-30 second tasks were launch and land practice. Lift was abundant. Look for other Throwback tasks in the near future.

Jon brought his UCSD Buddy Mike out again. Jon is hooking Mike up with a DLG; hope to have Mike flying in a contest soon.

Mark B. was out again helping out with timing and other chores. He has an Aerial and is sourcing a receiver battery and peg before it's ready to fly.

Next Contest is Feb 17th and Jon Garber will be the CD.

TPG History: The Trophy – Gary Fogel

This Month: Roger Taylor, 1978 Co-Modeler of the Year

Roger Taylor moved to California in 1962 from his birthplace in Pinckneyville, Illinois. He flew free flight gliders for 12 years starting in 1960. He reportedly served as Senior Chief Radioman on the aircraft carrier USS Constellation, although I had difficulty confirming that.

What is known for sure is that Roger Taylor joined the TPG in 1975. Well, surely thereabouts. At the time he was flying a Graupner Cirrus and became really interested in thermal soaring. There isn't any record of him flying at the cliffs in the old newsletters. In 1975, he competed in the club "Pro-Am" contest, flying together with Frank Cox of whom I've written about before. Over the winter holidays and into early 1976 he built a Mark's Models Windfree. He was a great builder, I think his free flight days served him well. In June of 1976 he wrote a nice article for the club newsletter on balsa wood and how to select which grain for what portion of the glider. By the end of 1976, his skills at TD soaring were improving and at the September contest he placed 9th out of 27 pilots with his Windfree (against a sea of other Windfrees). At the Pro-Am contest in Nov 1976 Roger placed first in the Am category beating 14 other amateurs. How's that for a meteoric rise!

Roger volunteered for the position of club Vice President and served in that role throughout 1977. At the 1976 Gulls X-mas party, he also CD'ed the "Sport Indoor" glider contest. Each party-goer was given a 10 cent chuck glider. The contest was a 15 second precision duration flight with a landing in a 3 foot circle. The contest went like this:

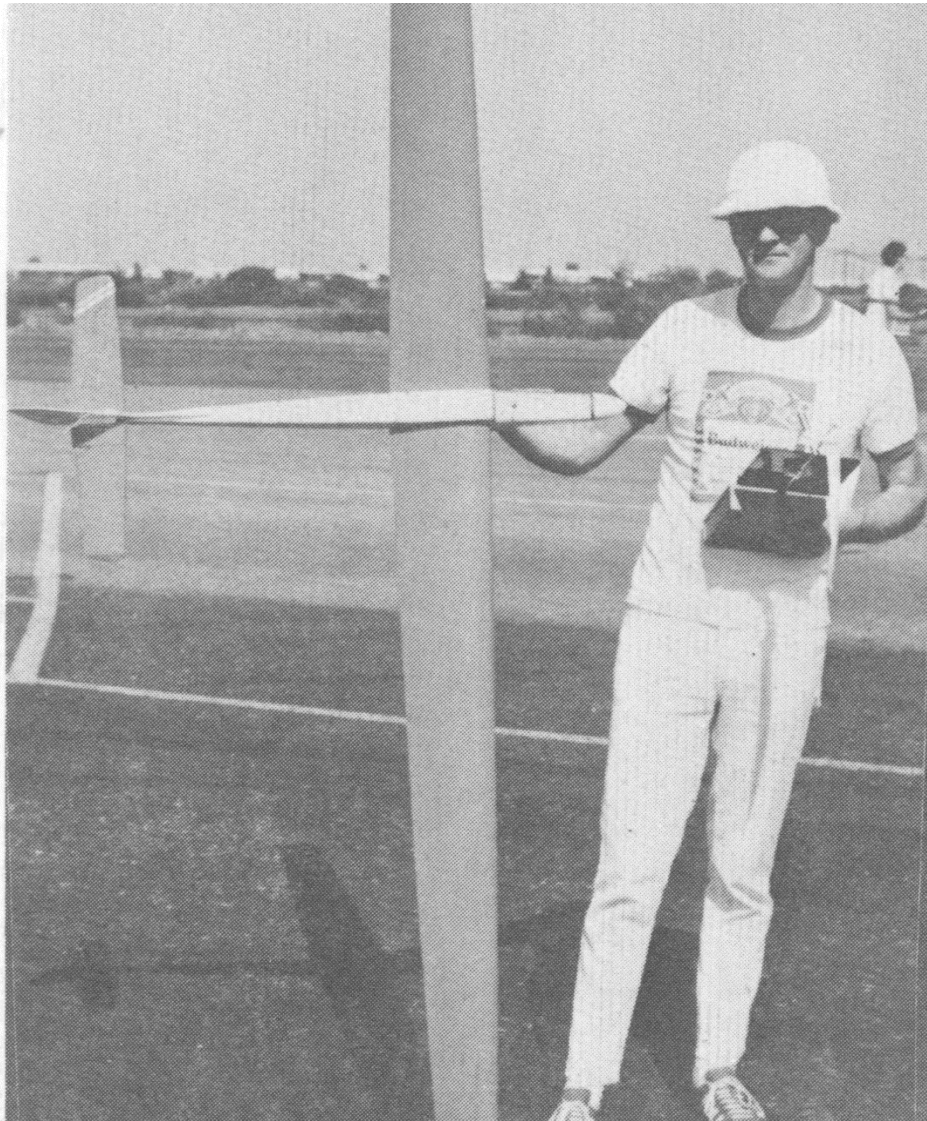
“When the contestant said GO, Bob Peck [of Peck-Polymers models – another great TPGer at that time] started a stop watch. It was the contestant’s task to guess when to throw the aircraft so as to have it land as close as possible to 15 seconds after the GO command was uttered.”

The winner received a box for an Aquila kit. What was inside the box? A kit for a Sinbad of course!



In 1977, he switched from flying a Windfree to an Aquila. This wasn't unusual. Just about everyone switched to Aquilas. (Hence the reason for the Sinbad in the Aquila box....there were no more Aquila kits in San Diego County.) At that same time, the 2-meter wingspan class (Class B) was just coming on line and was quite popular. Roger flew a 2m Super Questor. At the Gulls first 2 meter contest, Roger came in third out of 19. Also in 1977, the AMA NATS were held in Riverside, with RC soaring held near Gilman Hot Springs. Roger placed 7th overall in the modified standard class, TPG's best pilot in that category.

Roger Taylor and his Windfree at Hourglass Field in Mira Mesa.

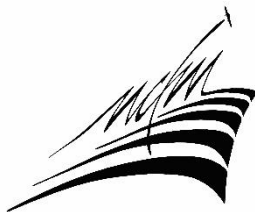
In 1978, Roger became TPG President. He must have enjoyed building planes over wintertime, because by February 1978 he was flying a large Aquila XL in the monthly TPG TD contests! At that contest, there were 14 pilots distributed as 10 Aquilas, 3 other designs, and 1 Aquila XL (Roger). Unfortunately Roger arrived late that day and was able to fly in only two rounds. He did much better at the 2 meter club contest in April, taking first place out of a field of 16 with his Super Questor!

Roger was honored with the 1979 TPG Modeler of the Year trophy for his club leadership and comradery which lasted for many years. I'm not sure what became of Roger. If anyone knows please let me know.

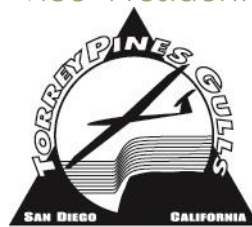
